1. After looking at the choices for a donate button, PayPal appears to be the clear choice as the way to add a donate button to accept contributions on

the www.orlandona.org website:

- A. Merchant bank accounts are very expensive to set up and difficult to manage

- B. PayPal has no startup cost and low transaction fee (2.9% + \$.30). Lower if we can qualify as nonprofit organization. Example: $\$ 10.00 - \$.29 - \$.30 = \$ 9.41$ donation. With this low transaction fee the WPSC does not feel a minimum donation to achieve break even is necessary.
- C. PayPal is easy to implement on website with different options for how transactions are processed
- D. You do not have to be a member of PayPal to make donations
- E. It would be feasible to add a shopping cart to sell literature, etc. in the future with no additional cost. This is already a feature of the recommended plan. There are considerations making this difficult as a person to manage cart and extra duties for treasurer or assistant treasurer.

2. WPSC recommends Area consider impact in the following areas:

- A. Someone in Area will be required to administer PayPal account.
 - 1. Will require internet access
 - 2. Will require knowledge of Goascna bank's routing and account numbers
 - 3. Will require additional work from Treasurer and/or Vice-Treasurer
 - 4. Management would be very simple and should not be time consuming
 - 5. Setup should also be simple and not time consuming
 - 6. Whoever administers account will have to start the account
- B. Impact on Area
 - 1. No negatives
 - 2. Positives are extra revenue source for Area
- C. Impact on Home Groups 7th tradition

There is no short term way to tabulate data on whether Donate button would impact collections at group meetings

Dear GO ASC,

I'd like to thank the members of the subcommittees and our RCMs on their efforts with GOASCNA Learning Day 2009. They did a great job providing information about the subcommittees and the NA structure and how they serve the Greater Orlando Area and the fellowship of NA. And I'd also like to thank our Alternate Secretary, Dennisse, and Billy H, for their service that evening as our speakers. I hope you are proud of your accomplishment. You all did a Great job!!

The Friday after May's ASC, your Chair received a phone call from a Helpline volunteer. He requested assistance to respond to a professional who has a hearing-impaired addict as a client. I spoke with the professional. This was not the same professional who addressed our ASC in FY 2007/08. But again, the professional was looking for a meeting where an ASL (American Sign Language) interpreter attended. I could only suggest that he get the addict to a meeting on our meeting list and ask for the DVD of *The Little White Book*. This is the fourth occasion in the last 2 years that GOASCNA has been asked to help the hearing impaired.

The 3rd occasion was brought to my attention by yet another professional than the two I mentioned above. She had a client who needed NA, and knowing that I'm in the rooms, she called me. I later learned from her that she found a meeting in AA in which to refer him, however she acknowledged that this addict needed more than AA's solution. He needed NA.

So we now know that AA in Orlando has a meeting with an ASL interpreter. My questions to you, our Trusted Servants, are:

- Why does NA in the Greater Orlando Area not have a meeting with an ASL interpreter?
- Are we carrying the message of recovery to the best of our ability?
- Are we fulfilling our primary purpose when addicts in our home towns cannot get the message of *recovery in our meetings*?
- If you answer 'no' to the prior question, why are we passing funds to the Florida Region and the WSO before helping the addict in our home towns?
- Is there a solution in the Greater Orlando Area that will allow the hearing impaired to hear NA's message of *recovery in our meetings*?

Some information that you will want to consider:

- The ***ideal room arrangement*** is classroom style, where the person sharing and the ASL interpreter face the hearing impaired addict. This is the set-up we see at conventions. Do we have a meeting, or some meetings, in the Greater Orlando Area that is currently set-up that way? Is that meeting/group an open meeting and willing to give a seat to a non-addict (the not-yet-admitting hearing-impaired addict or ASL interpreter)?

I have spoken with a representative from Interpretrek, a national ASL sign language company that has an office in Maitland, FL. She stated that even though 'classroom style' is the ideal

arrangement, any room arrangement where an ASL interpreter can sign to a hearing impaired addict is better than no ASL interpreter signing.

→ An **ASL interpreter costs money**. Is there a member, or are there any members, of our Fellowship who will be willing to make a commitment to sign at a meeting? Once a week? A couple times a month? Once a month? If yes, our fellowship can save money by not hiring an ASL interpreter to sign at the meeting(s).

The cost for an interpreter through Interprettek is \$55/hour with a 2-hour minimum. Before the economic downfall in 2009, they have provided pro-bono work for us. But with the current economic situation, they need some payment. They are sympathetic to NA's purpose and are willing to negotiate.

I petition you to give these questions and information your time and consideration. **Please** discuss this amongst yourselves and with your home groups.

Next month, we will be holding **our Area's annual Financial and Spiritual Inventory**. Per our guidelines, this event is to be attended by all outgoing and incoming Administration and Subcommittee Chairs and Vice-Chairs. All GSRs and homegroup members are welcome and encouraged to attend, as well. This inventory cannot be successful without your attendance. Our guidelines also state that the inventory is to be held during the last weekend in July. We are having scheduling conflicts with Saturday and Sunday afternoons, that weekend, so I would like to take a straw pole for the following 3 dates:

7/24 – Friday evening – 6 p.m.- 9 p.m., Activities Bowling Night begins at 10 p.m.

7/31 - Friday evening - 6 p.m.- 9 p.m

8/2 – Sunday - late morning/early afternoon

Lastly, our Area owns 57 English and 10 Spanish copies of "Self-Support – Principles and Practice". This IP is currently in the literature input and review process, and a revised IP will be part of the 2010 CAR. Hence these 67 IPs will be outdated by the Spring of 2010 and will need to be disposed if we still have them in inventory.

We have approximately 6 months to sell these IPs. The RSO will not take them back. Will each English-speaking group make a commitment to purchase 2-3 IPs in the next month or two? Will the 2 Spanish groups make a commitment to purchase 5 IPs in the next month or two? Or would you like the Area to evenly distribute these IPs amongst the groups, to get them out of the inventory and into the rooms? If you like this idea of distributing these IPs, please present a motion in today's New Business.

THE GUIDE TO FLORIDA REGIONAL SERVICE WORKGROUP
MAY 17, 2009

The following report outlines a model of Consensus Based Decision Making (CBCM) that was modified from Sacramento California. It has been revised to meet what we feel are the needs of the Florida Region based on the direction given this workgroup by motion 41P. Motion 41P said that we would use Consensus Based Decision Making. Unanimity minus 20% is the model that we have chosen, defined below.



A working definition of consensus:

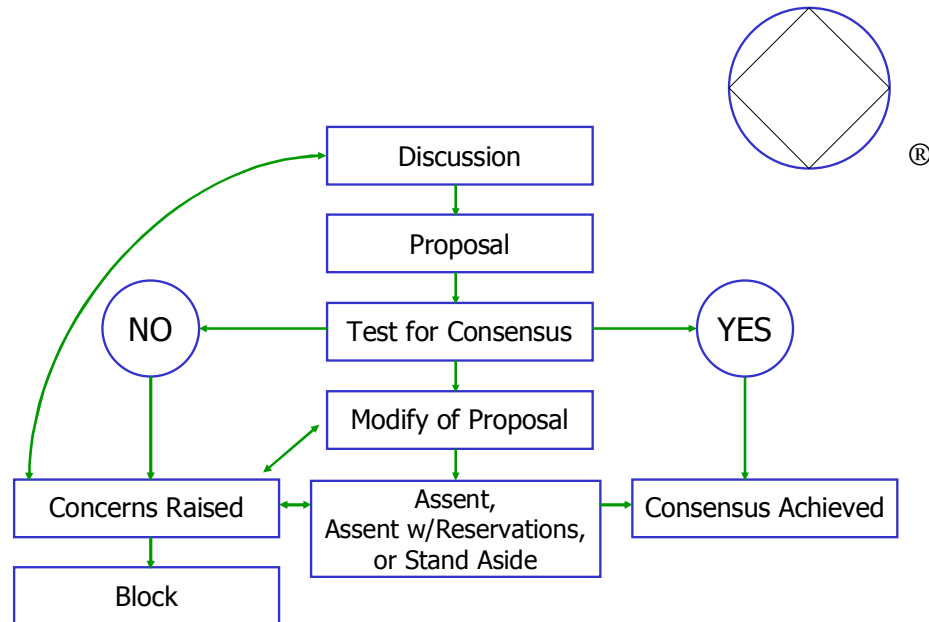
Consensus is a process by which a common mind of the meeting is sought about the wisest way to move forward on a particular issue at the time. It is derived from the Latin words *con* meaning “with” or “together with” and *sentir* meaning to “think” or “feel”. So, “*consensus*” means to “*think or feel together.*”

Consensus Based Decision Making is:

- A cooperative process for making decisions in which everyone consents to the decisions of the group
 - Not everyone’s first preference necessarily, but true consent
 - Decisions should reflect the integrated will of the whole group
 - Preserves the interests and integrity of all participants

- A problem-solving orientation for people who wish to work together
 - Not a process for determining whose ideas are best, but searching together for the best solution for the group
 - A questioning process, not the “okey-doke”
 - The decision is in this room — our job is to find it
 - Have respect and enjoy creative conflict

Below is a diagram of the flow of conversation and decision making:



Discussion of the item: Discussion takes place at the here as well as in your home groups or over coffee. The item is discussed with the goal of identifying opinions and information on the topic at hand. The general direction of the group and potential proposals for action are often identified during the discussion.

Formation of a proposal: Based on the discussion, a formal decision proposal on the issue is presented to the group. It should be written down and projected so we're clear on what is being discussed.

Test for consensus/Straw poll: thumbs up or down – to find degree of support and concerns of those opposed

Identification and addressing of concerns: If consensus is not achieved, each dissenter presents his or her concerns on the proposal, potentially starting another round of discussion to address or clarify the concern.

Modification of the proposal: The proposal is amended, re-phrased in an attempt to address the concerns of the decision-makers. The process then returns to the call for consensus and the cycle is repeated until a satisfactory decision is made.

Call for consensus: The facilitator of the decision-making body calls for consensus on the proposal. Each member of the group usually must actively state their agreement with the proposal, often by using a hand gesture or raising a colored card, to avoid the group from interpreting silence or inaction as agreement. The decision reached by consensus takes into account the insights of all members. The process ensures tat issues are fully aired and that all members feel they have been adequately heard. Decisions are taken not simply because one more than 50% of members are in favor of a proposal, but because all agree to a way forward. Some may feel that it's not necessarily they first option, but ALL can support it and commit themselves not to undermine the decision.

TRUE CONSENSUS is not the same as unanimity. We must be careful to recognize that real consensus arises out of real community, and often only through real tension as people express

their insights with passion and integrity, and yet with respect for really hearing others' points of view.

Ideally,

- concerns and reservations will be identified and addressed through the consensus based decision-making process
- When the call for consensus on a proposal is made, you should **ASSENT** if you support the proposal, all things considered.
- Assent does not indicate that you may agree with every aspect of a proposal, but that you...
 - have heard the discussion,
 - have had a chance to participate in the process of finalizing the proposal, and
 - are prepared to support the final proposal.
- **Assent.** This means that you support the proposal, all things considered. It may not mean that you are in agreement with every aspect, but that you have heard the discussion, have had a chance to participate in the process of finalizing the proposal, and are prepared to support the final proposal. Assent is signified by raising your Area's table card and remaining silent

There are three degrees of *dissent*:

- Assent with Reservations – I have some concerns that need to be heard.
- Stand Aside – I have concerns but will not stop the group from moving forward
- Block – I have a serious issue with the proposal based on traditions or concepts and will not give my consent.

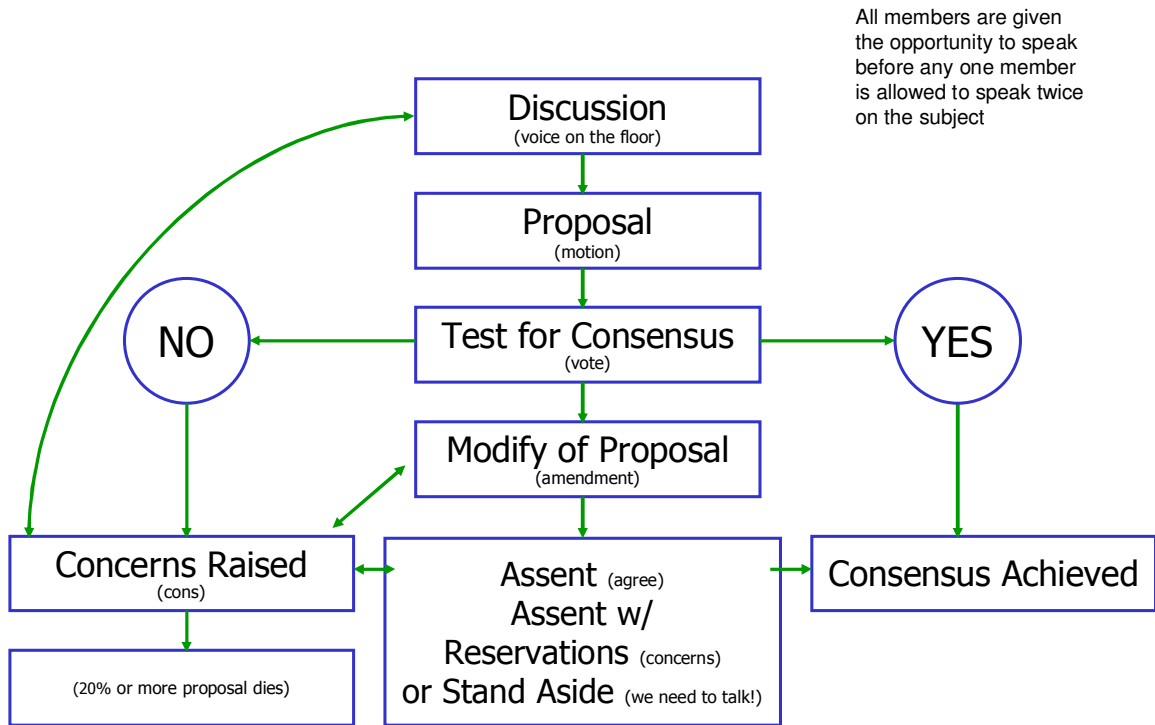
Assent with Reservations: Group members who are willing to let a motion pass but desire to register their concerns with the group may choose "assent with reservations." If there are significant reservations about a motion, the decision-making body may choose to modify or re-word the proposal. This option is not materially different from the assent option but is a way of giving addicts a place to stand when they do not need to object more strongly, but they want to note that they have reservations. Assent with Reservations by raising your hand and, when called on by the facilitator, simply saying "Assent with Reservations." The assumption is that the reservations have been heard already, and you are simply noting that you can support the proposal and continue to have these reservations.

Stand Aside: A "stand aside" may be registered by a group member who has a "serious personal disagreement" with a proposal, but is willing to let the proposal pass. Although stand asides do not halt a proposal, it is often regarded as a strong "nay vote" and the concerns of group members standing aside are usually addressed by modifications to the proposal. Stand asides may also be registered by users who feel they are incapable of adequately understanding or participating in the proposal. Should there be a sizable number of Stand Asides (20% of the groups present), this will indicate a consensus too weak to adopt the proposal. The proposal is then either dropped or delegated to the maker of the proposal or an Ad Hoc Committee for reworking.

Block: Given that a proposal can be defeated by a sufficient number of Stand Asides, the Block should be an extremely rare step taken only when a participant honestly believes that one of the Traditions or Concepts is directly violated by this proposal or that some very fundamental moral position of the participant is violated. An addict who blocks must be able to articulate which Tradition or Concept or Spiritual principle fundamental to NA is violated by the proposal.

Unanimity minus 20 % gives the ability of RCM's to actively block a decision.

To compare Consensus Based Decision Making with our RSC Rules of Order based in the WSC Rules of Order/Roberts Rules of Order please refer to the diagram below:



We, the members of the Guide To Florida Regional Service Workgroup, believe that this model for consensus based decision making meets the requirements agreed upon in Motion 41p for the Florida Region and have made a subsequent motion in May, 2009 to approve this specific model for use.
